Course Template Instructions: OpenBook – Upload-Exam without Video Proctoring

In a paper-based "OpenBook" exam, students are asked exam questions which they solve independently, handwritten on paper, in the allotted time. The questions are usually designed for application or transfer knowledge, and students can use aids. There is no proctoring for OpenBook exams. The students scan/photograph their solution at the end of the processing time and upload it to the exam course on the learning platform ("ILIAS-Lehre"). The correction of the examination is done by the teacher printed out on paper.

These instructions for the course template "OpenBook – Upload-Exam without Video Proctoring" (OpenBook – Upload-Prüfung ohne Videoaufsicht) take up a few of the most important ILIAS functions and ILIAS objects that are used in the corresponding template. This guide does not claim to be complete. It is only intended to point out the important steps and functions that should be configured correctly.

You can find the matching course template in the online support area for Lecturers in the category "Kursvorlagen" (accessible only with login in ILIAS). Please copy this template into the area specifically set up for online examinations "Online-Prüfungen <Semester>" in the ILIAS repository. This makes the necessary deletion and storage obligations of examination documents easier if they are filed separately from the rest of the courses.

Note: The self-declarations may only be uploaded by the participants after the test has been completed. They can also be signed electronically if the students do not have access to a printer. Handwritten, readable writing and signing of the declaration of self-sufficiency is also possible.




1. Course Template Settings & Add Members

If you have copied the course template "OpenBook – Upload without Video Proctoring" (OpenBook – Upload-Prüfung ohne Videoaufsicht), the course is initially set to "offline". It is only visible to you as the administrator of the course. As soon as you add further course administrators or course tutors to the course, they will also have the right to view the course and make changes.

1.1. Course settings

As a next step, we recommend that you define the event period and control the entry procedure - this should be set to "No independent entry":






1.2 Add members using the matriculation list

To prevent students from joining the course independently, the joining procedure has been set to "No Self-enrolment" (kein selbständiger Beitritt). We would like to suggest the following procedure for students to join your course:

A. List from HISinOne


Via Campus Management, you or your staff can have a list created of all students who have registered for the online examination via HISinOne. Please make sure that the details on the list include the matriculation numbers.

<u>B.1. ILIAS Course & ILIAS Groups - Adding members using the matriculation list</u>
After you have checked that you have the appropriate number of ILIAS groups in your course and that all information in the groups (for example: "Title" of the group) is correct, you can add the students to the course.



1.3. Add & customize information on the course interface

The course interface currently contains headings and small information texts that you can adopt in this form or adapt to your needs. To make changes, you must activate the function "Customize Page (Seite gestalten)":







2. Submission tasks – Declaration of Originality / Mock Exam / Configure Exam

In the course template you will find three different ILIAS submission tasks. The submission task serves as an area for students where you can upload your results. For example, the proof of identification or then later the written exam. To avoid confusion about where to upload which document, there is a separate submission task for each step.

Submission task


The third submission task is for uploading the Declaration of Originality. The functionality of the submission task is explained here as an example.







Note: Everyone in your course with administration rights can see the students' submitted files. The students can only see their own submission, but not those of their fellow students. The submission is bound to the respective user who submits the file.
